

**The project « The future of Europe - understanding between nations »  
was funded with the support of the European Union under the  
Programme "Europe for Citizens"**

**Applicable to the Strand 2 – Measure 2.1 "Town-Twinning"**

**Participation:** The project involved 757 citizens, notably 510 participants from the city of Žihárec (**Slovakia**), 40 participants from the city of Ugod (**Hungary**), 40 participants from the city of Viszák (**Hungary**), 40 participants from the city of Sic (**Romania**), 42 participants from the city of Mera (**Romania**), 43 participants from the city of Petisovci (**Serbia**), 42 participants from the city of Doroslovo (**Serbia**).

**Location/ Dates:** The event took place Žihárec (**Slovakia**), from 05/07/2018 to 20/07/2018

**Short description:**

On Thursday 05/07/2018, guests were coming and we took over the program and passed the project site with guests who were not here yet.

Friday 06/07/2018 is dedicated to the Future of Europe with our Future. We created the EU's information point, where the local experts could learn about the history, institutional systems and the EU support system. For children from local and partner communities, they also learned about history and EU institutions in playful competitions. Then, with MP Pál Csáky, the debates began on the topic of the day. Is this a round table discussion that states that the future of Europe is our future? - Euskeptic.

Saturday 07/07/2018 is dedicated to the EU's culture and heritage. Each partner presented their own values. Then, in the afternoon, traditional groups of partner villages and locals were introduced, and they also tasted traditional cakes and wines from locals and partners.

On Sunday 08/07/2018, history is reminded. Students from partner schools presented the end of the First World War and its impact on the Member States. There was an interview called Common Past, a common future. Then we remembered laying wreaths on the memory of the fallen wars and opened an exhibition of material memories from the First and Second World Wars. In the afternoon, a program of cultural entertainment started, where various generations were introduced.

On Monday 09/07/2018, the program was mainly for young people, but all generations attended a seminar organized in a spirit of solidarity and volunteering. The seminar presented the mission, principles and membership and participation in the European Solidarity Fund. In the afternoon, a round table discussion was held to discuss the outcome of the meeting and to plan further meetings.
